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
2. Web Talk on Women empowerment through Entrepreneurship







#### Webinar Report: Covid-19: Impact on Indian Society

The Department of History at St. Cyril's College, Adoor, Kerala, successfully conducted a webinar titled "Covid-19: Impact on Indian Society" on the 1st of July 2020. The event was held online using the Google Meet platform, with Dr. R Dayalan, a retired academician from Chennai, as the resource person. TheWebinar was inaugurated by Dr. Susha D, the Principal of our college. The webinar attracted an impressive audience of students, faculty members, and individuals interested in understanding the socio-economic and cultural impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic on Indian society.

#### **Objective of the Webinar**

The primary aim of the webinar was to explore the wide-ranging effects of the Covid-19 pandemic on Indian society. Dr. Dayalan focused on how the pandemic disrupted various aspects of daily life, including the economy, education, healthcare, social interactions, and the labor market. The session also aimed to shed light on how the crisis reshaped Indian society's future outlook and the socio-political changes that followed.

#### **Key Highlights of the Webinar**

 Political and Policy Responses: Dr. Dayalan addressed the governmental responses, including lockdowns, economic stimulus packages, and social welfare schemes, aimed at cushioning the impact on vulnerable populations.

#### **Participant Interaction**

The session was interactive, with participants joining the Google Meet platform from 10:40 AM onwards. Questions were taken from the attendees towards the end of the presentation. Dr. Dayalan answered queries related to the role of local governance in managing the pandemic and the long-term psychological effects of the pandemic on the general population.

#### **Technical Coordination**

The technical aspects of the webinar were handled smoothly by the organizers, with all participants requested to mute their microphones and turn off their video feeds to avoid distractions. The platform was accessible and user-friendly, allowing for seamless communication between the speaker and participants.


#### **Q&A Session**


#### **Participant Interaction**
