PREAMBLE

St Cyril's College, the pioneer institution of higher education managed by Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church came into existence in 1981 as a result of prayers and relentless labour of a group of visionaries and Late Lamented His Holiness Mathews II who saw that social and economic progress of a heterogeneous community is possible only through intellectual and spiritual enlightment. Started in November 1981 as a junior college affiliated to University of Kerala, the College offers Research in Physics, Post-Graduate course in Physics, English and Degree courses in Chemistry, History, English, Commerce, Economics and Mathematics & Computer Application. In the year 2012 the college was accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with 'B' Grade. The college completed its reaccreditation process in November 2018 and was awarded 'B' Grade in the second cycle.

FOUNDER'S VISION

St Cyril's College, Adoor was founded by the Late Lamented His Holiness Moran Mar Baselios Marthoma Mathews II to light and illumine the minds of the society. Kilivayal, a small sleepy village remained remote and alien to cultural and educational advancements with less conveyance facilities and educational institutions. Gaining a degree from a reputed college remained a distant dream for the students from modest agrarian communities obliterating their pursuit of higher education. This kindled His Grace to induct a college in this area fulfilling his vision of a holistic development of the region. St Cyril's College was thus raised at Cyril's Mount near Adoor allaying the anxieties of a poor community of attaining higher education. The college has a well defined mission and a goal platformed on the prayers if its founding father.

PATROM AND MANAGEMENT

St Cyril's College is one of the Malankara Orthodox Colleges, established and administered by Malankara Syrian Orthodox Church in accordance with the rights of the minority community guaranteed in the constitution of India and the college comes under the single Unitary Management. His Holiness Baselios Marthoma Mathew III Catholicos seated in the Apostolic see of St Thomas is the Educational Agency and His Grace Dr Zacharias Mar Aprem, the Metropolitan of Adoor-Kadampanad diocese is the Patron and Manager of the College and executes the administration through the Managing Board.

St.Cyril of Alexandria



St Cyril, The 24th Pope of Alexandria

St Cyril of Alexandria, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, was born at Alexandria, Egypt. He regarded the embodiment of God in the person of Jesus Christ to be so mystically powerful that it spread out from the body of the God-man into the rest of the race, to reconstitute human nature into a graced and deified condition of the saints, one that promised immortality and transfiguration to believers. St Cyril is counted among the Church Fathers and the Doctors of the Church, and his reputation within the Christian world has resulted in his titles Pillar of Faith and Seal of all the Fathers.

According to his theology, there were two states for the Son: the state that existed prior to the Son becoming enfleshed in the person of Jesus and the state that actually became enfleshed. His writings include the homily given in Ephesus and several other sermons. Some of his alleged homilies are in dispute as to its authorship. In several writings, St Cyril focuses on the love of Jesus to his mother. St Cyril is credited with creating a basis for all other mariological developments through his teaching of the blessed Virgin Mary, as the Mother of God.



FOUNDER

ST. CYRIL'S COLLEGE, ADOOR

His Holiness Moran Mar Baselios Marthoma Mathews II. the Catholicos of the East and 89th successor to the Holy Apostolic Throne of St Thomas, was born on January 30, 1915 at Perinad in Kollam District of Kerala. His Holiness had his early education in a local school. After his high school education he had his training at Old Seminary. Kottayam and also at Basil Dayara. Pathanamthitta. Later he joined Bishop's College, Calcutta for his B.D. Degree. He had his higher education in theology at General Theological Seminary, New York, He was ordained as Deacon in 1938 and as Priest in 1941. It was during his stay

at St George Dayara, Othara that Father Mathews made a mark as a devoted and an able priest of the Indian Orthodox Church. He was noted for his spiritual leadership and loving nature and could endear himself to everyone who came in contact with him. He was known as "Father Angel" at that time. On May 15, 1953 he was ordained as a Bishop of Orthodox church. He was only thirty eight then. The young Bishop grew in stature very soon. As Metropolitan of the Diocese of Kollamhe was fully responsible for its growth and progress and the number of parishes almost doubled within a short period. Several monasteries and convents were started. A large number of educational institutions and hospitals were established. His services in the field of education and social service are all very well known. Several colleges, schools, hospitals and other service institutions were successfully established and administered under his direct control and leadership. He has travelled wide in various countries: the United States, Canada, Europe, Malaya, Singapore, Gulf countries etc. and has attended various international meetings and conferences. It was in 1980 that he was unanimously elected by the Malankara Syrian Christian Association as successor to the throne of Catholicos of the East and Malankara Metropolitan. A good grator, an eminent scholar, a renowned theologian, an able administrator and a man of the Word of God, he had all the qualities needed for a spiritual leader and a good shepherd. With his intelligence, wisdom, love and vision and with his vast experience in various fields he proved himself successful as a skillful ecclesiastical head of an ancient Church. With his devotion and dedication in life and sincerity of purpose, no doubt the community at large is benefited by his true Christian life as a servant of God in the service of mankind. He entered into eternal rest on 26 Jan 2006 and was laid to rest in Mar Elia Chapel Sasthamcotta.

SCHOLARSHIPS & FEE CONCESSION

National Loan Scholarship:

The B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com students who hold the National Loan Scholarship for 2 years can continue to hold the scholarship provided they obtain 50% of marks for their qualifying plus two Examination. This scholarship can be held together with any other scholarship which shall not exceed half of the amount. Students admitted to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Courses can also apply for this scholarship provided they have scored 60 % marks for the qualifying examination. The scholarship is refundable when the scholar gets employed or after 3 years of completion of studies.

National Merit Scholarship:

The National Merit Scholarship is awarded to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com course provided the scholar has obtained 50 % marks for the Plus two Examination.

National Merit Scholarship for the Children of School Teachers: This scholarship is given to B.A/B.Sc/B.Com course provided the scholar has obtained 50 % marks for plus two examination.

State Merit Scholarship:

This scholarship is given to those who get the first five ranks in each district for plus two examinations.

State Merit Cum Means Scholarship:

This is a merit cum means scholarship. Students with more than 60% marks for the qualifying examinations can apply for this. The amount is Rs. 500/- per year for three years for B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com courses. This scholarship can be held together with any other scholarship which shall not exceed half of the amount. The scholar has to maintain 50% marks every year.

State scholarship for proficiency in arts:

This scholarship can be enjoyed by the students according to their proficiency in arts.

SSUE OF CERTIFICATES AND DOCUMENTS.

A student, past or present, applying for certification for transfer, age, character, marks, sports, N.C.C., shall do so in the prescribed form to the principal stating the year of study, admission number, class last attended and home address. Transfer Certificate will be issued only after the payment of alldues to the college.

Student applying for the issue of qualifying examination certificates must also clear all dues in the college.

The issue of marklist will be made only on the production of hall tickets.

Surrendering of Identity Card is essential in any of the above cases.

No certificate will be sent by post unless the transmission charges are prepaid.

CAUT ON DEPOSIT RULES

- Every student on admission to a course of study must pay the prescribed caution deposit along with the first instalment of the fees.
- The caution deposit will be refunded on completion of the course of study after adjusting dues, if any. However the caution deposit will be refunded before the completion of the course of study in case, the student leaves the College with transfer certificate.
- It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund in the prescribed form on the date notified on the notice board. The receipt issued for the remittance of caution deposit should be produced along with the application for refund. Failure to produce the original receipt will result in forfeiture of the claim for refund.
- 4. Claim for refund of caution deposit should be made before the re- opening of the college, after the completion of the course failing which the class number of students who did not claim the re-fund will be published on the college notice board. Amounts unclaimed after two months (April 1 to May 31 st) from the date of such publication will be forfeited.

as the Catholicos of the East &
Malankara Metropolitan (the Supreme
Head of the Malankara Orthodox
Syrian Church of India) on Friday, 15th
October 2021. His Holiness is the 92nd
Primate on the Apostolic Throne of St.
Thomas. His Holiness was born on 12
February 1949 to Mr Cherian Anthrayos

of Mattathil family, being a member of St Peters Church, Vazhoor. After his school education, he joined Kerala University and passed his BSc Chemistry, After his BSc, he joined Orthodox Seminary, Kottayam, and had his GST degree. His Holiness took his BD degree from the Serampore University and did his higher studies in Theology at Theological Academy, Leningrad, Russia. Thereupon he joined Oriental Institute, Rome, and took his MTh and PhD from there. His Holiness was ordained a deacon in 1976 and a priest in 1978 by HH Baselios Mathews I. His Holiness was escalated to the post of an Episcopa on 30 April 1991 at a function at Parumala, and metropolitan in 1993. He is a well-known teacher and a faculty member of the Orthodox Seminary, Kottayam, A philanthropist, he works relentlessly for the uplift of the poor, especially women. He has started many ventures to help give employment opportunities to women from the economically backward classes. His Holiness was also served the Holy Episcopal Synod as its secretary. His Holiness has authored a few devotional and contemplative books in Malayalam.

H.G. Dr Zacharias Mar Aprem, the first Metropolitan of Adoor-Kadampanad Diocese, was born on March 1966 in Chunkathara, Malapuram district.

After completing B.Sc from Calicut University, he took B.D and M.Th from Serampoor University. He earned Ph.D in Advaitha Vedantha (D.Th) from the same University. He was the Principal Secretary to His Holiness Baselios Marthoma Didymus I, the Catholicos of the East and Malankara Metropolitian, His Grace is the

President of Senate of Serampore, Manager of MOC Colleges, Director of Sruthi School of Liturgical Music and also Registrar and Governing Board member of Orthodox Theological Seminary Kottayam. On 12th May 2010 he was ordained as a Bishop of Malankara Syrian Orthodox Church.

As a good orator, an eminent scholar, poet, a renowned theologian and an able administrator he has got the qualities needed for a spiritual leader. With Almighty's grace and our manager H.G Dr Zacharias Mar Aprem's guidance along with his painstaking efforts, both visible and non-visible, St Cyril's College has earned a glorious position in the educational map of Kerala.

- Candidates from other Universities should produce migration certificates along with an Eligibility Certificate from the University of Kerala.
- 4. Orthodox Students should produce a Conduct Certificate from the priest of their parish.
- Those who seek concession must produce income and community certificates from the Village Officer.
- Candidates selected for admission will be required to appear along with their guardians for an interview before the Principal. The selection is provisional and is subject to confirmation only after the interview and scrutiny of certificates.
- Candidates will have to pay the first installment of tuition fees, special fees, caution deposit and such other fees, prescribed by the University before they are allowed to attend the classes.
- Any candidate found to have obtained admission by false representation shall be removed from the rolls.
- Every student of the college will be issued an Identity Card on enrollment. All students are bound to wear the card.

RULES FOR REMITTING FEES

Fees will be collected in 2 semesters in the months of June and November. All Special Fees and caution deposits should be remitted along with the first installment.

Fees will be received in the College Office as per the schedule given below:

D3 Classes - within seven woking days of June & November
D2 Classes - within seven working days of June & November

D1 Classes - at the time of admission

Post Graduate Classes - Fourth working day of every month

If the student fails to pay the fees on the due dates he shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs.5.00 till the 10th day and an additional fine of Rs.10.00 will have to be paid thereafter.

If the fees and fines of an installment are not paid before the last opportunity given for the payment of that of the installment, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college with effect from the date following expiry of this period and the student will not get the benefit of attendance also from the date of removal from the rolls of the college. If the student is to be re-admitted he/she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal and also has to remit all the arrears of fees with fine. This re-admitted student will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of re-admission with a re-admission fee of Rs. 50.

The last opportunity for payment of an installment of fee mentioned above is defined as the last working day previous to fee due date of the succeeding installment.

Every student is liable to pay the prescribed fee as per rule during the part of which his/her name is on the rolls of the College. Students should obtain a receipt from the cashier for any payment made in the College. These receipts should be retained by them for later reference or verification. Fees once paid will not be refunded under any circumstance.

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MEDICAL INSPECTION

Every student shall undergo a Medical Inspection by a Medical Officer appointed by the College on such dates as may be notified from time to time. Failure to present oneself for Medical Inspection is a serious offence.

Whenever a Medical Certificate has to be produced by a student, such certificate should be from either the College Doctor or from another Doctor approved by the Principal.

WOMEN'S HOSTEL

- St. Mary's Women's Hostel aims to provide a convenient and a comfortable stay for the outstation girl students. It works to minimize the cost in terms of time so that the hostel residents can use the same for other significant purposes. The girl's Hostel also satisfies the vital objective of ensuring safety of girls.
- Students who want admission to hostel must apply for the same in the prescribed admission form(available from college office) with two passportsize photos and remit the caution deposit in the college office.

- Forcing a student to boycott class without his/her consent to participate in strike, demonstration, dharna etc.
