














17 June 2022

Reading Day June 20, 2022








International Yoga Day

From her, it could be understood that they needed essential supplies as most of the inmates were aged and down with illness. They had medical equipment and medicines could only be purchased with prescription. They were badly in need of food items. Thus, it was decided to buy the food items and it included Rava 100 kg, Pachari 1 sack, Uzhunnu 7.5 kg, Sugar 50 kg, Close Up paste 15 nos, Lux soap 15 nos and Dr Wash soap 15 nos. Some of the volunteers also brought used cloths that are neat, and they were also given. The volunteers spent time with the inmates talking to them and asking about their comforts. Two of the inmates also sang songs making the atmosphere very jovial. It was a heartening experience. They also gave handcrafted wax candles as return gifts for the Principal. It was a heartening feeling to have visited them on October 1st itself.
