The college is founded by the Late Lamented His Holiness Mathews II to propagate education and enlightenment to the community. The started in November 1981 as a Junior College affiliated to the University of Kerala. The College is recognized under section 2(f) and 12(B)of the UGC Act of 1956. It had gained the Minority Status in 2011. The college offers Post Graduate courses in Physics, English and Degree courses in Chemistry, History, English, Economics and Commerce. A new course, B.Sc Mathematics and Computer Applications(Double Main) was introduced in 2020. In the year 2012 the college was accredited by NAAC with 'B' grade. It is one of the Malankara Orthodox Colleges established and administered by the Malankara Syrian Orthodox Church, Adoor -Kadampanad Diocese in accordance with the rights of the minority community guaranteed in the constitution of India. The college got B Grade with a grade point of 2.2 in the second NAAC assessment on November, 2019.

St Cyril's College has made an indelible impression in the rural background it is placed, touching and moulding the lives of many. It is located in Kilivayal, Adoor a rustic vicinity remote from the humdrums of urban lifestyle. The institution with its humble beginnings tries to impart education to the less advantaged students in the society. 

- Evaluation system and results

The evaluation system of aided colleges under the University of Kerala typically follows the guidelines set by the university, which include both internal and external assessments. Here's an overview of the key components of the system:

- 1. Internal Assessment (Continuous Evaluation)
- 2. External Assessment (End-Semester Examination)

Weightage: The external examination typically accounts for 75-80% of the total marks. The exam is conducted at the end of each semester. It follows the syllabus and guidelines prescribed by Kerala University.

The format usually includes a mix of descriptive, short answer, and objective questions, depending on the course. Practical exams are held for science subjects and courses requiring laboratory work. The University of Kerala follows a Credit and Semester System (CSS) for both undergraduate and postgraduate programs. Grades are awarded based on a 10-point grading scale (Outstanding): 9.0 to 10.0 grade points, A+ (Excellent): 8.0 to 8.9,A (Very Good): 7.0 to 7.9,B+ (Good): 6.0 to 6.9,B (Above Average): 5.0 to 5.9,C (Average): 4.0 to 4.9,F (Fail): Below 4.0.Students need to maintain at least 75% attendance in each course to be eligible to appear for the end-semester exams. Students who are not satisfied with their results can apply for revaluation or scrutiny. There is also a provision for writing improvement exams for betterment of grades in certain subjects.

The college has a tutorial system where the student is guided and supported by a tutor in both curricular and co-curricular activities. The Mentoring system of the college also help in creating a safe physical and psychological space for the students. The Government aided programs, WWS(Walk with a Scholar) and SSP(Scholar Support program) identify the bright and average students and provide them with facilities based on their intellectual capacity. Dr Alen S and Ms Elizabeth work as Conveners of the programs respectively.

The Department of English has established an admirable tradition in which first-year B.A. English students compile comprehensive documentation on Nobel Laureates in Literature. This ongoing initiative not only highlights the students' growing academic skills but also reflects their commitment to exploring and appreciating the latest literary achievements and trends.

The task of documenting the Booker Prize winners-Margaret Atwood and Bernardine Evaristo, , was assigned to the first-year M.A.students admitted in that academic session. Under the guidance of faculty advisor Ms.Jesna Mariyam Johnson, an editorial board was formed with Anju Mary as Editor-in-Chief and Kesiya T.Biju as Sub-Editor. The documentation was released by H.G. Dr. Zacharias Mar Aprem Metropolitan and Sri.Chittayam Gopakumar .



The task of documenting Peter Handke, the Nobel Laureate in Literature in 2019, was assigned to the first-year B.A.students admitted in that academic session. Under the guidance of faculty advisor Ms. Mariam John, an editorial board was formed with Siyana S. as Editor-in-Chief and Vismaya Vijay as Sub-Editor. The students conducted extensive research to gather information about Handke's biography, literary works, and critical reception, using both primary and secondary sources to provide a thorough overview.



III. Research, Innovation and Extension

The college in accordance with its vision and mission of Rural development carried out a project in five colleges on the topic Sustainable Development . The programme was funded and planned by Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE), Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India, Hyderabad. The motto of the programme was, "Where there is Rural Wellbeing there is Universal Prosperity". The Project was undertaken by Dr Mini Samuel, IQAC Coordinator and a team comprising the faculty of the college, Ms Sowmya Mary Thomas, Ms Elizabeth George, Ms Mariam John and Ms Lini K Mathew. The programme was funded with an amount of Rs 25000/-. The teachers visited various colleges and took resource classes on Sustainable Development and also conducted Green Audit of the college. - Participating in national integration camps.






Innovation Ecosystem




Seminars and workshops bring experts from various fields to share cutting-edge research, trends, and technologies with students and faculty. This helps bridge the gap between



theoretical learning and practical application.




their curricula. Sensitising the undergraduate level students to the urgent need for environmental protection and biodiversity conservation can have far-reaching positive outcomes for the environment.


