The Hard Rain Project (HRP), founded in 2005addresses the broad challenges of climate change, poverty eradication and the environment. It works with world-renowned artists, scientists and communicators to bring its message to students at schools and universities, and to a wider public, through exhibitions, books, films, talks and events. HRP's founder, Mark Edwards, is one of the most widely published photographers in the world, recognized as the first to specialize in sustainable development issues.

The original "Hard Rain" exhibition is a collaboration with singer and songwriter Bob Dylan. It features a 60-metre long outdoor display in which each line of Dylan's song 'A Hard Rain's A-Gonna Fall' is illustrated with world-class photographs bringing global challenges alive in a moving and unforgettable way.

More than 15 million people have already seen the exhibitions at over 150 venues worldwide, including in city centres, botanical gardens, more than 50 universities and schools and at the UN Headquarters in New York. Talks have been presented at universities in all world regions and in places as diverse as national parliaments, prisons, companies and at leading music and arts festivals.

After the exhibition at St Cyril's College, The PG Dept of English, decided to carry the message to youngsters capable of spreading the message of environmental stewarding by organising it a Marthoma Mathew II Engineering College and also for students of CT Eapen Memorial HSS, Sathamcottah. The exhibition was organised on 18 Nov 2019 at 2.00 p.m. Rev Fr Philip Tharakan delivered the keynote while HG Zacharia Mar Anthonios Metropolitan of Kollam Diocese of Malankara Orthodox Church inaugurated the exhibition.

The parameters like (alkalinity, turbidity, pH, TDS, DO, salinity) were checked in our laboratory using Water Analyzer 371 (Systronics). The reports were distributed through proper channel to the persons concerned.


